A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE TRANSFER OF THE FUNCTIONS OF THE LICENSE
102 PLATE AUCTION GROUP TO THE COLORADO DISABILITY FUNDING
103 COMMITTEE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries>.)

Currently, the license plate auction group has authority to sell registration numbers for motor vehicle license plates. The money is used to help people with disabilities to navigate the social security process. The disability-benefit support contract committee administers this support. The bill transfers the functions of the license plate auction group to the

Colorado disability funding committee (formerly the disability-benefit support contract committee) and repeals the license plate auction group. In connection with this transfer, the bill:

- ! Reduces the number of members of the committee from 13 to 9, with 3 members having disabilities, 3 having experience with business, and 3 having experience in nonprofit entities; and
- ! Provides that the department of public safety may prohibit any action of the committee if the decision would affect state policy concerning the use or display of license plates or registration numbers.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend with**
3 **relocated provisions** part 22 of article 30 of title 24 as follows:

6 **24-30-2201. Short title.** ~~This~~ THE SHORT TITLE OF THIS part 22
7 ~~shall be known and may be cited as~~ IS the "Laura Hershey
8 ~~Disability-Benefit~~ DISABILITY Support Act".

9 **24-30-2202. Definitions.** As used in this part 22, unless the
10 context otherwise requires:

11 (1) "Committee" means the ~~disability-benefit support contract~~
12 ~~committee~~ COLORADO DISABILITY FUNDING COMMITTEE created in section
13 24-30-2203.

14 (2) "Disability benefits" means cash payments from social security
15 disability insurance under Title II of the federal "Social Security Act", 42
16 U.S.C. sec. 401 et seq., as amended, cash payments made by the federal
17 government to persons who are aged, blind, or disabled under Title XVI
18 of the federal "Social Security Act", 42 U.S.C. sec. 401 et seq., as
19 amended, and long-term care under the "Colorado Medical Assistance

1 Act", articles 4 to 6 of title 25.5, C.R.S.

2 (3) "Nonprofit entity" means an entity incorporated under the
3 "Colorado Revised Nonprofit Corporation Act", articles 121 to 137 of
4 title 7, C.R.S., or a tax-exempt entity under 26 U.S.C. sec. 501 (c) (3) of
5 the federal "Internal Revenue Code of 1986".

6 (4) "Recipient" means a person who receives disability benefits
7 or long-term care services.

8 (5) "REGISTRATION NUMBER" MEANS THE UNIQUE COMBINATION
9 OF LETTERS AND NUMBERS ASSIGNED TO A VEHICLE BY THE DEPARTMENT
10 UNDER SECTION 42-3-201, C.R.S., AND REQUIRED TO BE DISPLAYED ON
11 THE LICENSE PLATE BY SECTION 42-3-202, C.R.S.

12 (6) "VEHICLE" MEANS A VEHICLE REQUIRED TO BE REGISTERED
13 PURSUANT TO PART 1 OF ARTICLE 3 OF TITLE 42, C.R.S.

14 **24-30-2203. Colorado disability funding committee.** (1) The
15 ~~disability-benefit support contract committee~~ COLORADO DISABILITY
16 FUNDING COMMITTEE is hereby created within the department of
17 personnel. The committee consists of ~~thirteen~~ NINE members appointed
18 by the governor. ~~as follows:~~ AT LEAST THREE OF THE MEMBERS MUST
19 HAVE DISABILITIES, AT LEAST THREE OF THE MEMBERS MUST HAVE
20 EXPERIENCE AND EXPERTISE IN BUSINESS, AND AT LEAST THREE MEMBERS
21 MUST HAVE EXPERIENCE AND EXPERTISE IN OPERATING A NONPROFIT
22 ENTITY.

23 ~~(a) Five members who are persons with disabilities and currently~~
24 ~~receiving disability benefits or have received application assistance;~~

25 ~~(b) One member of a statewide, cross-disability organization~~
26 ~~representing persons with disabilities;~~

27 ~~(c) One member who is trained to increase access to disability~~

1 ~~benefits for persons with disabilities by an organization supported by the~~
2 ~~United States social security administration;~~

3 ~~(d) One member who is a medical doctor;~~

4 ~~(e) One member who is a mental health professional;~~

5 ~~(f) One member who is an expert in nonprofit management;~~

6 ~~(g) One member appointed by the executive director of the~~
7 ~~department of personnel;~~

8 ~~(h) One member who has experience and expertise in business;~~

9 ~~and~~

10 ~~(i) One member who has experience with grant programs.~~

11 (2) Members of the committee serve three-year terms; except that
12 ~~THREE members appointed under paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of this~~
13 ~~section~~ AS DETERMINED BY THE GOVERNOR serve an initial term of one
14 year, and ~~THREE members appointed under paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of~~
15 ~~subsection (1) of this section~~ AS DETERMINED BY THE GOVERNOR serve an
16 initial term of two years.

17 (3) An act of the committee is void unless a majority of the
18 members has voted in favor of the act.

19 (4) The committee shall implement section 24-30-2204 using the
20 disability-benefit support fund created in section 24-30-2205.

21 (4.5) The committee shall implement section 24-30-2204.5 using
22 the disability investigational and pilot support fund created in section
23 24-30-2205.5.

24 (5) The committee is authorized to seek and accept grants or
25 donations from private or public sources for the purposes of this part 22;
26 except that the committee shall not accept a gift, grant, or donation that
27 is subject to conditions that are inconsistent with this part 22 or part 13 of

1 article 75 of this title regarding the status of grants and donations made
2 to state agencies. ~~The committee shall transmit the moneys to the~~
3 ~~disability-benefit support fund.~~

4 (6) The committee has the following duties and powers:

5 (a) To sue and be sued and otherwise assert or defend the
6 committee's legal interests;

7 (b) To prepare and sign contracts;

8 (c) To have and exercise all rights and powers necessary or
9 incidental to, or implied from, the specific powers granted in this part 22;
10 and

11 (d) To fix the time and place at which meetings may be held.

12 (7) The committee may hire employees or obtain the services of
13 professional advisors.

14 (8) The attorney general is the legal counsel for the committee.

15 **24-30-2204. Program to assist persons to obtain disability**

16 **benefits - repeal.** (1) ~~Within six months after the first transfer to the~~

17 ~~disability-benefit support fund from the registration number fund created~~

18 ~~in section 42-1-407, C.R.S. WHEN ADEQUATE FUNDING IS AVAILABLE, the~~

19 committee shall invite nonprofit entities to submit a proposal for a

20 program to aid persons with disabilities in accessing disability benefits.

21 To qualify, the nonprofit organization must be based in Colorado and

22 governed by a board that:

23 (a) Is composed of persons with a demonstrated commitment to
24 improving the lives of recipients with disabilities;

25 (b) Contains members who understand a range of significant
26 disabilities, including physical and mental; and

27 (c) Contains a majority of either:

1 (I) Recipients with disabilities; or
2 (II) Family members of recipients with disabilities who have
3 experience in representing the interests of a person with a disability.

4 (2) (a) (I) The committee shall review the proposed programs and
5 shall award a contract to the nonprofit entity that best meets the
6 requirements of this section in accordance with the "Procurement Code",
7 articles 101 to 112 of this title.

8 (II) The term of the contract is one year. Before the contract
9 expires, the committee shall evaluate whether the nonprofit entity and the
10 contract are reasonably meeting the requirements of this section,
11 including objective and quantitative evaluations, whenever possible, of
12 the satisfaction of program participants, the program's success in
13 obtaining disability benefits for program participants, the program's
14 effectiveness at helping program participants obtain jobs, and
15 improvements in the quality of life of program participants. The
16 committee shall include the evaluation criteria in the contract.

17 (III) The committee may renew the contract annually for up to five
18 years. After five years, the committee shall reopen the contract to a
19 competitive bid process.

20 (b) The committee shall not award the contract unless the proposal
21 includes:

22 (I) A system for evaluating whether a person with a disability is
23 reasonably able to navigate the application process to obtain disability
24 benefits, health care, and employment;

25 (II) A system for prioritizing the need of applicants based upon
26 the evaluations;

27 (III) A plan for assisting persons with disabilities in navigating the

1 processes of obtaining and retaining disability benefits, health care, and
2 employment;

3 (IV) A plan for establishment of working relationships with state
4 agencies, county departments of human services, health care providers,
5 the United States social security administration, and the business
6 community;

7 (V) A policy of preferential hiring of persons with disabilities;

8 (VI) Reasonable standards for accounting control of expenditures;

9 (VII) Metrics to evaluate the program's quality and
10 cost-effectiveness; AND

11 (VIII) Effective July 1, ~~2016~~ 2020, the ability to serve persons
12 with disabilities statewide. ~~and~~

13 ~~(IX) A plan for serving persons with disabilities statewide within~~
14 ~~five years. This subparagraph (IX) is repealed, effective July 1, 2016.~~

15 (c) The committee shall not discriminate against a contracting
16 entity for advocacy concerning persons with disabilities.

17 (3) The entity awarded a contract under this section shall make
18 quarterly reports of expenditures to the department of personnel, which
19 shall make the reports available to the committee. The committee shall
20 include in the contract a method and format for making the reports.

21 **24-30-2204.5. Program to investigate, fund, and pilot projects**
22 **or programs to benefit persons with disabilities.** (1) The committee
23 shall accept and review proposals to fund projects or programs that study
24 or pilot new and innovative ideas that will lead to an improved quality of
25 life or increased independence for persons with disabilities. Proposals
26 may be accepted throughout the year, and grants or loans may be made by
27 the committee at its regular meetings. The disability investigational and

1 pilot support fund created in section 24-30-2205.5 shall be the sole source
2 to fund any grants or loans made pursuant to this section.

3 (2) To be eligible for funding pursuant to this section, a project or
4 program must:

5 (a) ~~(f)~~ Demonstrate a capability to be self-sustaining or otherwise
6 be able to develop long-term independent funding; and

7 ~~(H)~~ (b) Have a governing body or board that is composed of
8 persons with a demonstrated commitment to improving the lives of
9 persons with disabilities and have a majority be persons with disabilities
10 or family members of persons with disabilities. ~~or~~

11 ~~(b) Be the license plate auction group established in section~~
12 ~~42-1-403, C.R.S.~~

13 **24-30-2205. Disability-benefit support fund.** The
14 disability-benefit support fund is hereby created in the state treasury. The
15 ~~moneys~~ MONEY in the fund ~~consist~~ CONSISTS of amounts ~~transferred~~
16 CREDITED to the fund ~~under section 42-1-407, C.R.S.,~~ FROM THE SALE OF
17 REGISTRATION NUMBERS UNDER THIS PART 22 or transferred to the fund
18 under section 24-30-2203 (5). The committee shall use the ~~moneys~~
19 MONEY in the fund to implement this part 22. ~~except that the committee~~
20 ~~may direct the state treasurer to transfer moneys in the fund to the~~
21 ~~registration number fund created in section 42-1-407, C.R.S., to fund the~~
22 ~~implementation of part 4 of article 1 of title 42, C.R.S.~~ The committee
23 shall not use more than five percent of the money in the fund to
24 administer this part 22. The state treasurer shall credit all interest earned
25 on the investment of ~~moneys~~ MONEY in the fund to the fund. At the end

27 earned from investment, ~~remain~~ REMAINS in the fund. The general

3 **24-30-2205.5. Disability investigational and pilot support fund.**

4 There is hereby created in the state treasury the disability investigational
5 and pilot support fund, referred to in this section as the "fund", that shall
6 consist of moneys transferred to the fund pursuant to section 25.5-5-308
7 (8), C.R.S. ~~any moneys that may be appropriated to the fund by the~~
8 ~~general assembly, and any gifts, grants, or donations received by the~~
9 ~~department of personnel for the purpose of implementing this section.~~

10 The ~~moneys~~ MONEY in the fund ~~are~~ IS subject to annual appropriation by
11 the general assembly for the direct and indirect costs associated with the
12 implementation of the pilot program. Any ~~moneys~~ MONEY in the fund not
13 expended for the purpose of this section may be invested by the state
14 treasurer as provided by law. All interest and income derived from the
15 investment and deposit of ~~moneys~~ MONEY in the fund must be credited to
16 the fund. Any unexpended and unencumbered ~~moneys~~ MONEY remaining
17 in the fund at the end of a fiscal year must remain in the fund and shall
18 not be credited or transferred to the general fund or another fund. If this
19 section is repealed, prior to its repeal, all unexpended and unencumbered

22 **24-30-2206. [Formerly 42-1-402] License to buy and sell**

23 **selected registration numbers for license plates.** (1) The state or a
24 person may sell, and the state or a person may purchase, the exclusive
25 right to use a registration number selected by the ~~group~~ COMMITTEE under
26 section ~~42-1-404~~, C.R.S. 24-30-2208 for the purpose of registering a
27 vehicle under article 3 of ~~this~~ title 42, C.R.S.

1 (2) The right to use a registration number is a license, the use of
2 which is subject to compliance with this ~~part 4~~ PART 22. The duration of
3 the license is determined by the ~~group~~ COMMITTEE.

4 **24-30-2207. [Formerly 42-1-403] License plate auction group**
5 **- duties and powers.** ~~(1) The license plate auction group is hereby~~
6 ~~created within the office of the governor.~~

7 ~~(2) The group consists of eleven members, appointed as follows:~~

8 ~~(a) One member who is appointed by the executive director of the~~
9 ~~department of revenue and who is not a member of the Colorado advisory~~
10 ~~council for persons with disabilities created in section 24-45.5-103,~~
11 ~~C.R.S.;~~

12 ~~(b) One member who is appointed by the governor to represent~~
13 ~~persons with disabilities and who is not a member of the Colorado~~
14 ~~advisory council for persons with disabilities;~~

15 ~~(c) One member appointed by the president of the senate to~~
16 ~~represent persons with disabilities;~~

7 number is a charitable donation because it exceeds the market value of the

9 credit authorized under section 39-22-535, C.R.S., from the sale.

10 ~~(6)~~ The attorney general is the legal counsel for the group.

11 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY MAY PROHIBIT ANY
12 ACTION OF THE COMMITTEE, OR ITS AGENTS, THAT CONCERNS THE SALE OF
13 LICENSE PLATES OR REGISTRATION NUMBERS IF THE DECISION WOULD
14 AFFECT THE POLICY OF THE STATE OF COLORADO AS IT RELATES TO THE
15 USE OR DISPLAY OF LICENSE PLATES OR REGISTRATION NUMBERS.

16 **24-30-2208. [Formerly 42-1-404] Sale of registration numbers.**

17 (1) The ~~group~~ COMMITTEE shall raise money by auctioning to a buyer the
18 right to use valuable letter and number combinations for a registration
19 number.

20 (2) (a) The ~~group~~ COMMITTEE shall study the market and
21 determine which registration numbers are the most valuable, including
22 both the types of plates currently issued and any type of plate that has
23 been historically issued. Based on the study, the ~~group~~ COMMITTEE shall
24 select the most valuable registration numbers and request the department
25 OF REVENUE to verify whether plates with the registration numbers are
26 currently issued. The ~~group~~ COMMITTEE shall not send the request to the
27 department OF REVENUE more than once every six months.

1 (b) Upon receiving the ~~group's~~ COMMITTEE'S request, the
2 department OF REVENUE shall verify whether the plates are currently
3 issued. If the plate is not currently issued, the department shall reserve the
4 registration number until the ~~group~~ COMMITTEE notifies the department
5 to release the registration number.

6 (c) If a registration number is not currently issued, the ~~group~~
7 COMMITTEE may auction the right to use the registration number in a
8 manner calculated to bring the highest price; except that the department
9 OF REVENUE may deny the sale or use of a registration number that is
10 offensive or inappropriate.

11 **24-30-2209. [Formerly 42-1-405] Creation of a private market**
12 **for registration numbers - fee.** (1) The ~~group~~ COMMITTEE shall raise
13 money by creating a market, which may include an online auction site, for
14 registration numbers using methods that are commercially reasonable,
15 account for expenditures, and ensure the collection of the state's approval
16 and transfer royalty.

17 (2) The royalty for the state's approval and transfer of the right to
18 use a registration number is twenty-five percent of the sale price of the
19 transfer. At the time of sale, the purchaser shall pay the royalty to the
20 ~~group~~ COMMITTEE. This payment is not in lieu of the normal registration
21 fees or specific ownership tax.

22 (3) A person shall not sell a registration number and the
23 department OF REVENUE shall not assign a registration number as a result
24 of the right to use the number being sold to a vehicle unless the
25 registration number was sold using the market created by the ~~group~~
26 COMMITTEE.

27 **24-30-2210. [Formerly 42-1-406] Administration.** (1) The

1 ~~group~~ COMMITTEE shall notify the department OF REVENUE when the right
2 to use a registration number has been sold and the ~~group~~ COMMITTEE has
3 collected the state's sale proceeds or approval and transfer royalty. Upon
4 receiving the notice, the department OF REVENUE shall create a record in
5 the Colorado state titling and registration system, created in section
6 42-1-211, C.R.S., containing the name of the buyer, the vehicle
7 identification number, if applicable, and the corresponding registration
8 number.

9 (2) If the registration number consists of a combination of letters
10 and numbers that is not within the normal format of license plate
11 currently produced for the department OF REVENUE, the department OF
12 REVENUE shall issue the plates as personalized plates under section
13 42-3-211, C.R.S.; except that, notwithstanding section 42-3-211, C.R.S.,
14 the auction ~~group~~ COMMITTEE may sell, and the buyer or any subsequent
15 buyer may use:

- 16 (a) A registration number or letter of one position; or
17 (b) Any symbol on the standard American keyboard or approved
18 by the ~~group~~ COMMITTEE.

19 (3) The ~~group~~ COMMITTEE shall transfer the ~~moneys~~ MONEY
20 collected under this ~~part 4~~ PART 22 to the state treasurer, who shall credit
21 ~~them~~ THE MONEY to the ~~registration number~~ DISABILITY-BENEFIT SUPPORT
22 fund created in ~~section 42-1-407~~ 24-30-2205.

23 (4) The ~~group~~ COMMITTEE may contract with one or more public
24 or private entities to implement this ~~part 4~~ PART 22.

25 (5) Any ~~moneys~~ MONEY received by the ~~group~~ COMMITTEE FROM
26 THE SALE OF REGISTRATION NUMBERS shall be deposited in the ~~registration~~
27 ~~number~~ DISABILITY-BENEFIT SUPPORT fund.

1 **24-30-2211. [Formerly 24-30-2206] Implementation.**

2 (1) Except as provided for in subsection (2) of this section, the general
3 assembly does not intend to require the department of personnel to
4 expend ~~moneys~~ MONEY to implement this part 22. Notwithstanding any
5 other section of this part 22, the department of personnel and the
6 committee need not implement this part 22 until the disability-benefit
7 support fund contains enough money to implement this part 22.

8 (2) The department of personnel shall begin implementation of
9 section 24-30-2204.5 at such time as the disability investigational and
10 pilot support fund contains sufficient funds for implementation, as
11 determined by the committee.

12 **24-30-2212. [Formerly 24-30-2207] Sunset review - repeal of**
13 **part.** (1) This part 22 is repealed, effective September 1, 2021.

14 (2) Prior to such repeal, the department of regulatory agencies
15 shall review the assistance program for disability benefits as provided for
16 in section 24-34-104.

17 **24-30-2213. Administration - transfers - repeal.** (1) AT LEAST
18 SIXTY DAYS BUT NOT MORE THAN NINETY DAYS FOLLOWING THE
19 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, THE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER TO
20 THE FUND ALL UNEXPENDED AND UNENCUMBERED MONEY IN THE
21 REGISTRATION NUMBER FUND CREATED BY SECTION 42-1-407, C.R.S.,
22 BEFORE ITS REPEAL IN 2016, AS THIS FUND EXISTED BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE
23 DATE OF THIS SECTION.

24 (2) (a) NOTWITHSTANDING THE REPEAL OF PART 4 OF ARTICLE 1 OF
25 TITLE 42, C.R.S., THE REGISTRATION NUMBER FUND AND THE LICENSE
26 PLATE AUCTION GROUP CREATED IN SECTION 42-1-403, C.R.S., BEFORE ITS
27 REPEAL IN 2016, CONTINUE IN EXISTENCE FOR SIXTY DAYS AFTER THE

1 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION TO WIND UP AFFAIRS AND MAKE OR
2 FACILITATE THE TRANSFERS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION.

3 (b) ANY REGISTRATION NUMBERS RESERVED BY THE LICENCE
4 PLATE AUCTION GROUP BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION

7 (c) WITHIN SIXTY DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
8 SECTION, THE LICENSE PLATE AUCTION GROUP SHALL TRANSFER ALL
9 RECORDS, PROPERTY, AND INFORMATION TO THE COMMITTEE.

10 (3) THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE SHALL ASSIST THE LICENSE
11 PLATE AUCTION GROUP IN IMPLEMENTING THIS SECTION.

12 (4) BY JULY 1, 2017, THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT OR
13 REAPPOINT THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE TO THE NEW TERMS

15 (5) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017.
