101 CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF APRIL 12, 2016, AS A DAY TO

1 WHEREAS, Purebred dogs are bred to maintain specific breed
2 characteristics, which makes a breed's temperament and behavior more
3 predictable, from barking to retrieving to protecting to friendliness with
4 strangers; and

5 WHEREAS, Purebred dogs are living legacies of the cultures that
6 created them, and every breed was developed with a purpose in mind; and

7 WHEREAS, Historically, these dogs have worked alongside their
8 people and provided them companionship; and

9 WHEREAS, Today, the service of these breeds continues as they

2 while serving as guide dogs, service dogs, therapy dogs, conservation
3 dogs, livestock guardians, search-and-rescue dogs, earth dogs, police
4 dogs, canine soldiers serving by the sides of our military men and women,
5 and ultimately guardians of family, home, and hearth; and

6 WHEREAS, Purebred dogs have been of enormous help to
7 medical science, serving as models for many heritable human diseases,
8 playing a role in humanity's understanding of the human and canine
9 genomes, and benefiting pharmaceutical research and development; and

10 WHEREAS, Purebred dogs are working dogs, serving as
11 avalanche dogs, trackers and trailers, herders, controllers of vermin, water
12 rescuers, carting and sled dogs, retrievers, protectors, hunters, and bird
13 dogs, and always they are the heartbeat of a companion near and dear to
14 humans; and

15 WHEREAS, All dogs should be valued, whatever their ancestry,
16 but the purpose-bred dog and the predictability of its breed should be
17 cherished and preserved; and

18 WHEREAS, Each breed is indelibly etched in the history of the
19 culture that created it just as surely as that culture's music, art, and
20 language; now, therefore,

21 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventieth*
22 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:*

23 That we, the members of the General Assembly, on April 12, 2016,
24 proudly recognize and celebrate Colorado's purebred dogs and the many
25 service and companion benefits they provide in Colorado.
