BILL TOPIC: ALLOW CITY TO SET HOUSING AUTHORITY COMMISSION TERM LENGTH

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, local housing authority commissioners, who are not ex officio, serve five-year terms. This bill allows a city council to determine, by resolution, the term length served by their housing authority commissioners not to exceed five years. If a city council does not set a term length, the commissioners continue to serve five-year terms.

Local Government Impact

The bill may increase expenditures for municipalities that change the length of the term served by their commissioners. This cost includes the administrative costs of holding hearings and generating public input. In addition, costs associated with appointing new commissioners could increase or decrease based on the term length. However, for municipalities that keep the term length at five years, there is no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 9, 2016, and takes effect August 10, 2016, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
