Summary of Legislation

This bill authorizes the Marijuana Enforcement Division (MED) in the Department of Revenue to promulgate rules related to advertising that is likely to reach underage persons under the Medical Marijuana Code. This authority currently exists in the Retail Marijuana Code.

State Expenditures

This bill will minimally increase workload for the MED to promulgate rules in FY 2016-17. The MED is appropriated funds to make and enforce rules as part of its regulatory oversight of medical and retail marijuana. As such, the rulemaking and enforcement required under this bill can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on June 10, 2016, and takes effect August 10, 2016, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
