BILL TOPIC: SUBMISSION THRESHOLD FOR HIGHER ED CASH PROJECTS

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, higher education institutions may submit lists of capital construction projects anticipated to be commenced within the next two years using institutional cash funds, and costing more than \$2 million, to the Capital Development Committee (CDC) for review and approval. Any project listed and reviewed by the CDC as part of an institution's two-year projection of cash need may commence without further legislative review, with certain exceptions related to borrowing. This bill, **recommended by the CDC**, increases the threshold for projects reviewed through two-year cash lists from \$2 million to \$10 million for everything but acquisitions, new construction, and projects financed using the state's credit rating.

State Expenditures

The bill may result in a decrease in state expenditures from cash funds held by institutions of higher education. Eliminating the legislative review of certain capital projects costing more than \$2 million and less than \$10 million could accelerate a project's time line and thus avoid possible increases in inflation or interest rates. The amount of any such decrease cannot be determined at this time.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 10, 2016.
