Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.002 Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision reducing appropriations to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing by a total of \$9,493 for FY 2016-17, including \$9,084 General Fund and \$409 cash funds from the Hospital Provider Fee. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will receive \$20,424 less federal funds to implement the act.
