**Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**L.001** Bill Sponsor amendment **L.001** (attached) strikes language that was added in 2013 when there was uncertainty regarding how much marijuana tax revenues would be collected. The language is no longer required since funding for the collection of data will be from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund and revenues are projected to be available to support the appropriation.
