A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A PROHIBITION ON THE IMPOSITION OF A CONVENIENCE
102 FEE ON CERTAIN SALES TRANSACTIONS.

Bill Summary

The bill prohibits a seller from imposing a convenience fee on transactions that involve admission to entertainment events.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

1 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 5-2-212.5 as
2 follows:

3 **5-2-212.5. Convenience fees in entertainment transactions -**
4 **prohibition.** EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SECTIONS 24-19.5-103
5 (3) AND 29-11.5-103 (3), A SELLER SHALL NOT IMPOSE A CONVENIENCE FEE
6 ON ANY SALES TRANSACTION INVOLVING ADMISSION TO AN
7 ENTERTAINMENT EVENT.

8 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date -**
9 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following
10 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the
11 general assembly (August 9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10,
12 2017); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1
13 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section,
14 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part
15 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election
16 to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the
17 date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

18 (2) This act applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable
19 effective date of this act.
