A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE SCHEDULED REPEAL OF REPORTS BY HIGHER
102 EDUCATION AGENCIES TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Statutory Revision Committee. Pursuant to section 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), Colorado Revised Statutes, any report that is required to be made to the general assembly by an executive agency or the judicial branch on a periodic basis expires on the day after the third anniversary of the date on which the first report was due unless the general assembly, acting by bill, continues the requirement. The bill addresses the reporting

requirements of higher education agencies.

Sections 3, 7, 8, and 13 of the bill repeal reports that were scheduled to repeal according to section 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I). Currently there is no repeal date listed in the organic statute.

Section 3 of the bill also adds a repeal date in the organic statute that coincides with the scheduled repeal date specified in section 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I).

Sections 1, 2, 4 through 6, 9 through 12, and 14 through 16 of the bill amend the organic statute to continue indefinitely the reporting requirements to send a report to the general assembly notwithstanding the repeal date specified in section 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I).

Duties and powers of the commission with respect 5 to student fees - report. (2) NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-136 6 (11)(a)(I), on or before January 15, 2012, and on or before January 15 7 each year thereafter, the department shall report to the education 8 committees of the house of representatives and the senate, or any 9 successor committees, concerning the governing boards' fee policies and 10 the collection and use of student fees. 11 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-1-106, amend 12 (7)(a) and (11)(b) as follows: 13 23-1-106. Duties and powers of the commission with respect 14 to capital construction and long-range planning - legislative 15 **declaration - definitions - report.** (7) (a) The commission annually shall 16 prepare a unified, five-year capital improvements report of projects to be 17 constructed, but not including those capital construction or capital 18 renewal projects to be undertaken pursuant to subsection (9) of this 19 section, coordinated with education plans. NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION

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24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), the commission shall transmit the report to the office of state planning and budgeting, the office of the state architect, the capital development committee, and the joint budget committee, consistent with the executive budget timetable, together with a recommended priority of funding of capital construction or capital renewal projects for the system of public higher education. The commission shall annually transmit the recommended priority of funding of capital construction or capital renewal projects to the capital development committee no later than November 1 of each year.

- (11) (b) NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), the commission shall submit a compilation of the projects to the office of the state architect and the capital development committee on or before December 1 of each year.

The department of higher education shall report the 25 information disaggregated by high school and school district of 26 graduation, to the extent practicable, and by ethnicity, gender, financial

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AND NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), each state institution of higher education shall prepare a written report for each quarter of the fiscal year, which shall include the total amount of net revenues generated during such period from any facility, activity, or operation managed by such state institution of higher education which THAT is an enterprise and the total amount of such net revenues and any other thing of value received by such state institution of higher education from such enterprises. Such THE report shall be filed with the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the chairman CHAIR of the joint budget committee no later than thirty days after the close of such period.

SECTION 17. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
