101 CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF COLORADO STATE HIGHWAY **3** AS

- 102 THE "CAPTAIN JEFF KUSS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY".
 - 1 WHEREAS, Marine Corps Captain Jeff Kuss was born in 1984 in 2 Durango, Colorado to Michael and Janet Kuss; and WHEREAS, As a child, Captain Kuss always preferred playing 3 with toy planes, and he began flying at the age of 15; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Captain Kuss attended Durango High School, graduating in 2002, and Fort Lewis College, graduating in 2006 with a 6 7 degree in Economics; and 8 WHEREAS, Captain Kuss joined the United States Marine Corps 9 and served a deployment in the Middle East; and





WHEREAS, Captain Kuss started a career in aviation in July 2007
 when he reported to the Naval Air Station in Pensacola, Florida, and went
 on to graduate from the Navy Fighter Weapons School, also known as
 "Top Gun", in 2012; and

- 5 WHEREAS, Captain Kuss was one of only three pilots selected to 6 join the Blue Angels in 2014, an elite United States Navy Flight 7 Demonstration Squadron, and accumulated more than 1,400 flight hours 8 and 175 landings on aircraft carriers; and
- WHEREAS, A huge fan of the Denver Broncos, Captain Kuss, as
 a member of the 2016 Blue Angels team, was one of six pilots who flew
 over Levi's Stadium in Santa Clara, California, for Super Bowl 50; and
- WHEREAS, On June 2, 2016, Captain Kuss was training for a
 Blue Angels air show in Smyrna, Tennessee, when his plane went down
 during a "Split S" maneuver; and
- WHEREAS, Captain Kuss was able to avoid nearby
 neighborhoods and schools, but he was unable to eject from the jet in time
 to save his own life, dying that day at age 32; and
- WHEREAS, During his career, Captain Kuss received various
 awards, including the Strike Flight Air Medal and the Navy and Marine
 Corps Achievement Medals, and he received various personal and unit
 awards; and
- WHEREAS, Captain Kuss had climbed all the 14ers in Colorado
 and was known as a humble, sweet, focused, hard-working man dedicated
 to his country and he will be sorely missed; now, therefore,
- Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-first
 General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:
- 27 (1) That Colorado State Highway 3 be renamed the "Captain Jeff28 Kuss Memorial Highway".
- (2) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may accept
 and expend gifts, grants, and donations for the purpose of the initial
 placement of the two signs to mark Colorado State Highway 3 as the
 "Captain Jeff Kuss Memorial Highway".

 to Captain Kuss' wife, Christina Kuss, and his children, Calvin and
 Sloane; his parents, Michael and Janet Kuss; his brother, Eric Kuss; and
 the Durango High School Alumni Association.
