BILL TOPIC: REPEAL OBSOLETE LAW COLORADO CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS

Summary of Legislation

Recommended by the Statutory Revision Committee, this bill repeals a law relating to Colorado's congressional districts. It was rendered obsolete by the redistricting premised on the 2010 federal census. Additionally, certain portions of this law were held unconstitutional by the State Supreme Court in *People Ex Rel. Salazar v. Davidson*.

Assessment

Repealing these statutes will have no impact on the expenditures or revenues of any state agency or local government, and, therefore, this bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 8, 2017, and takes effect August 9, 2017, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
