BILL TOPIC: REPORTING REQUIREMENTS BY DOR TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, any report that is required to be submitted to the General Assembly by an executive agency or the Judicial Department expires after three years, unless otherwise specified in statute. The bill:

- repeals the following reports that have no repeal dates listed in the statute, but would have expired in 2017 pursuant to state law:
 - ▶ Annual Retail Marijuana Report (Joint Budget and Finance Committees);
 - ▶ Annual Report of Liquor Enforcement Actions (General Assembly);
 - ▶ Quarterly Report on Conservation Easement Tax Credit (Joint Budget and Finance Committees);
 - ▶ Annual Report on Special License Plate Fees (General Assembly); and
 - ▶ Annual Emissions Quality Assurance and Enforcement Issues Report (Transportation Legislation Review Committee);
- adds a repeal date to coincide with the three year expiration for the following reports:
 - ▶ Annual Report on Electronic Benefits Transfers (Health and State Affairs Committees); and
 - ▶ Annual Report on Exceptions Processing at the Division of Motor Vehicles (Transportation Legislation Review Committee); and
- repeals the following reports:
 - ▶ Monthly Statements of Lottery Revenues, Prize Disbursements, and Other Expenses (General Assembly, Governor); and
 - ▶ Annual Report of the Colorado Lottery (General Assembly, Governor).

Assessment

The bill does not affect the revenue or expenditures of any state agency and is therefore assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 16, 2017, and takes effect August 9, 2017, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
