**Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, any report that is required to be submitted to the General Assembly by an executive agency or the judicial branch expires after three years, unless otherwise specified in statute. **Recommended by the Statutory Revision Committee**, this bill:

- repeals the annual report prepared by the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE) on the Hospitality Career Secondary Education Grant Program as of December 16, 2019; and
- continues indefinitely CDLE's annual report on the Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund balance.

**State Expenditures**

Overall and beginning in FY 2017-18, this bill increases workload for CDLE by a minimal amount to continue preparing a specified report that otherwise would have been repealed. This workload can be accomplished within existing workloads and no change in appropriations is required.

**Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 28, 2017, and takes effect August 9, 2017, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
