BILL TOPIC: RELOCATE TITLE 12 DANCE HALL & ESCORT & PAWNBROKER

Summary of Legislation

This bill relocates the statutes concerning local government regulation of dance halls from Title 12 to Title 30 and the regulation of escort services and pawnbrokers from Title 12 to Title 29 of the Colorado Revised Statutes (C.R.S.) and makes minor technical changes.

Background

The Committee on Legal Services is currently supervising the Office of Legislative Legal Services in a two-year project to recodify Title 12 of the C.R.S., as directed by Senate Bill 16-163. In anticipation of this recodification, House Bill 17-1006 was enacted to allow agencies to request the Secretary of State to update statutory citations in the Code of Colorado Regulations without the agency notice, comment, or hearing requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act.

Assessment

This bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact. Relocating these sections of statute will not impact the revenue, expenditures, or workload of any state agency or local government.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 9, 2017, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 10, 2017, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
