Summary of Legislation

This bill makes four General Fund transfers totaling \$10,000,000 to Tier 2 funded programs for FY 2017-18.

State Revenue

State transfers. This bill requires the following transfers from the General Fund on July 1, 2017:

- \$954,545 to the Forest Restoration and Wildfire Risk Mitigation Grant Program Cash Fund in the Department of Higher Education;
- \$1,186,363 to the Healthy Forest and Vibrant Communities Fund in the Colorado Forest Service;
- \$45,455 to the Wildland-urban Interface Training Fund in the Department of Public Safety (DPS);
- \$86,364 to the Wildfire Preparedness Fund in the DPS;
- \$4,090,909 to the Species Conservation Trust Fund in the Department of Natural Resources (DNR);
- \$2,452,193 to the Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation Aquatic Nuisance Species Fund in DNR; and
- \$1,184,171 to the Division of Wildlife Aquatic Nuisance Species Fund in DNR.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on May 3, 2017.
