A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING AN INCREASE IN THE AMOUNT OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**
102 **THAT CAN BE PROVIDED FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL**
103 **CONSTRUCTION UNDER THE "BUILDING EXCELLENT SCHOOLS**
104 **TODAY ACT", AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, INCREASING**
105 **THE AMOUNT OF RETAIL MARIJUANA EXCISE TAX REVENUE THAT**
106 **IS CREDITED TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION**

Currently, the first \$40 million of retail marijuana excise tax revenue annually collected is credited to the public school capital construction assistance fund (assistance fund) for purposes of the "Building Excellent Schools Today Act" (BEST) and the remainder of the revenue is credited to the state public school fund. For state fiscal years commencing on and after July 1, 2018, **sections 1 and 3** of the bill increase the amount of retail marijuana excise tax revenue credited to the assistance fund to the greater of 90% of the revenue annually collected or the first \$40 million of such revenue. The remainder of the revenue continues to be credited to the state public school fund. **Section 2** increases the maximum total annual amount of lease payments on BEST lease-purchase agreements authorized to be paid with both state money and local matching money to \$110 million for the 2018-19 fiscal year and \$120 million for the 2019-20 fiscal year and for each fiscal year thereafter.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-43.7-104, **amend**
(2)(d) as follows:

**22-43.7-104. Public school capital construction assistance fund
- creation - crediting of moneys to fund - use of fund - emergency
reserve - creation - reserve account - creation and use.**

(2) (d) Beginning January 1, 2014, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2018, the state treasurer, as provided in section 39-28.8-305 (1)(a), ~~C.R.S.~~, shall annually credit to the assistance fund the first forty million dollars received and collected from the excise tax on retail marijuana imposed pursuant to part 3 of article 28.8 of title 39. ~~C.R.S.~~ ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2018, THE STATE TREASURER, AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 39-28.8-305 (1)(a), SHALL ANNUALLY CREDIT TO THE ASSISTANCE FUND THE GREATER OF THE FIRST FORTY MILLION DOLLARS RECEIVED AND COLLECTED FROM THE EXCISE

1 TAX ON RETAIL MARIJUANA IMPOSED PURSUANT TO PART 3 OF ARTICLE
2 28.8 OF TITLE 39 OR NINETY PERCENT OF THE MONEY RECEIVED AND
3 COLLECTED FROM THE TAX. The state treasurer shall credit twelve and
4 five-tenths percent of the amount annually credited pursuant to this
5 ~~paragraph (d)~~ SUBSECTION (2)(d) to the charter school facilities assistance
6 account, which account is created within the assistance fund.

7 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-43.7-110, **amend**
8 (2)(a) introductory portion, (2)(a)(V), and (2)(a)(VI); and **add** (2)(a)(VII)
9 and (2)(a)(VIII) as follows:

10 **22-43.7-110. Financial assistance - grants - lease-purchase**
11 **agreements.** (2) Subject to the following requirements and limitations,
12 the board may also instruct the state treasurer to enter into lease-purchase
13 agreements on behalf of the state to provide financial assistance to
14 applicants by financing public school facility capital construction projects
15 for which the state board has recommended and the capital development
16 committee has authorized the provision of financial assistance that
17 involves a lease-purchase agreement pursuant to section 22-43.7-109 (7):

18 (a) Subject to the limitation specified in ~~paragraph (b) of this~~
19 ~~subsection (2)~~ SUBSECTION (2)(b) OF THIS SECTION, the maximum total
20 amount of annual lease payments payable by the state during any fiscal
21 year under the terms of all outstanding lease-purchase agreements entered
22 into by the state treasurer as instructed by the board pursuant to this
23 subsection (2) is:

24 (V) Ninety million dollars for the 2016-17 fiscal year; ~~and~~

25 (VI) One hundred million dollars for the 2017-18 fiscal year; ~~and~~
26 ~~for each fiscal year thereafter;~~

27 (VII) ONE HUNDRED TEN MILLION DOLLARS FOR THE 2018-19

1 FISCAL YEAR; AND

2 (VIII) ONE HUNDRED TWENTY MILLION DOLLARS FOR THE 2019-20
3 FISCAL YEAR AND FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER.

4 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 39-28.8-305,
5 as follows:

6 **39-28.8-305. Distribution of tax collected.** (1) All ~~moneys~~
7 MONEY received and collected in payment of the tax imposed by ~~the~~
8 ~~provisions of this part 3~~ shall be transmitted to the state treasurer, who
9 shall distribute the money as follows:

10 (a) (I) UNTIL JUNE 30, 2018, the first forty million dollars received
11 and collected annually shall be transferred to the public school capital
12 construction assistance fund created by article 43.7 of title 22 ~~C.R.S.~~, or
13 to any successor fund dedicated to a similar purpose; and

14 (II) ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2018, THE GREATER OF THE FIRST
15 FORTY MILLION DOLLARS RECEIVED AND COLLECTED ANNUALLY OR
16 NINETY PERCENT OF THE MONEY RECEIVED AND COLLECTED ANNUALLY
17 SHALL BE TRANSFERRED TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION
18 ASSISTANCE FUND CREATED BY ARTICLE 43.7 OF TITLE 22 OR TO ANY
19 SUCCESSOR FUND DEDICATED TO A SIMILAR PURPOSE; AND

20 (b) Any amount remaining after the transfer pursuant to ~~paragraph~~
21 ~~(a) of this subsection (1)~~ SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION shall be
22 transferred to the public school fund created in section 3 of article IX of
23 the state constitution, which is the same as the public school fund
24 described in section 22-41-102. ~~C.R.S.~~

25 **SECTION 4. Appropriation.** For the 2018-19 state fiscal year,
26 \$34,000,000 is appropriated to the department of education. This
27 appropriation is from the public school capital construction assistance

1 fund created in section 22-43.7-104 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the
2 department may use this appropriation for public school capital
3 construction assistance board - lease payments.

4 **SECTION 5. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
5 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
6 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
