101 **CONCERNING THE MEMBERSHIP EXPANSION OF THE COLORADO TASK**  
102 **FORCE ON DRUNK AND IMPAIRED DRIVING.**

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**Bill Summary**

The bill adds to the Colorado task force on drunk and impaired driving:

- ! A community-based representative from the substance use disorder prevention field;
- ! A representative from the marijuana enforcement division; and

! A representative from the retail or medical marijuana industry who is an owner or manager of a retail dispensary. Each of these members are to be appointed by the executive director of the department of transportation or the director's designee.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-1306, **amend**  
3 **(3)(a)(II), (3)(a)(IX) introductory portion, and (3)(a)(IX)(K); and add**  
4 **(3)(a)(IX)(M) and (3)(a)(IX)(N) as follows:**

5 **42-4-1306. Colorado task force on drunk and impaired driving**  
6 **- creation - legislative declaration.** (3) (a) The task force shall consist  
7 of:

8 (II) ~~Two~~ **THREE** representatives appointed by the executive  
9 director of the department of revenue, with the following qualifications:

10 (A) One representative with expertise in driver's license  
11 sanctioning; ~~and~~

12 (B) One representative with expertise in enforcement of the state's  
13 liquor sales laws; **AND**

14 (C) **ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE'S**

3           **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
4 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
5 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August  
6 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a  
7 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
8 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
9 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect  
10 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
11 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
12 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
