A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING MODIFICATIONS TO THE "NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR ACT", AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, REQUIRING A NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR TO DISCLOSE THAT THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR IS REGISTERED AND UPDATING THE TERMS THAT A NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR MAY USE.

Bill Summary

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-37.3-105, amend 3 (3)(b) as follows: 4 12-37.3-105. Practice of naturopathic medicine by 5 naturopathic doctors - exclusions - protected activities - rules. 6 (3) (b) Before conducting an initial examination of a patient, a 7 naturopathic doctor shall obtain the patient's informed consent to the 8 examination, evidenced by a written statement in a form prescribed by the 9 director and signed by both the patient and the naturopathic doctor. The 10 statement must: 11 (I) Disclose that the naturopathic doctor is not a medical doctor or 12 physician licensed under article 36 of this title 12; 13 (II) Recommend that the patient have a relationship with a 14 MEDICAL DOCTOR OR licensed physician; and 15 (III) Indicate that the naturopathic doctor will attempt to develop 16 and maintain a collaborative relationship with the patient's LICENSED 17 physician, if the patient has a relationship with a licensed physician; AND 18 (IV) DISCLOSE THAT THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR IS REGISTERED 19 AND NOT LICENSED. 20 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-37.3-110, amend 21 (2), (3)(a), and (4); and **add** (2.5) as follows:
