A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING MODERATION OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE EMISSIONS INSPECTION PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill extends the motor vehicle emissions inspection cycle for 1982 and newer model motor vehicles from every 2 years to every 4 years and specifies that a motor vehicle does not fail an emissions inspection solely because a check-engine light is illuminated on the motor vehicle's dashboard.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-304, amend
3	(3)(b) as follows:
4	42-4-304. Definitions relating to automobile inspection and
5	readjustment program. (3) (b) (I) The certification of emissions control
6	will be issued to the vehicle owner at the time of sale or transfer except
7	as provided in section 42-4-310 (1)(a)(I). The certification of emissions
8	control will be in effect for twenty-four FORTY-EIGHT months for 1982
9	and newer model vehicles. 1981 and older model vehicles and all vehicles
10	inspected by the fleet-only air inspection stations shall be issued
11	certifications of emissions control valid for twelve months.
12	(II) Except as provided in section 42-4-309, the executive director
13	shall establish a biennial FOUR-YEAR inspection schedule for 1982 and
14	newer model vehicles, an annual inspection schedule for 1981 and older
15	model vehicles, and a five-year inspection schedule for a 1976 or newer
16	motor vehicle registered as a collector's item.
17	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-306, amend
18	(7)(b)(I) as follows:
19	42-4-306. Powers and duties of commission - automobile
20	inspection and readjustment program - basic emissions program -
21	enhanced emissions program - clean screen program. (7) (b) (I) The
22	commission shall by regulation RULE provide that no vehicle shall be
23	issued a certificate CERTIFICATION of emissions compliance or waiver if:
24	(A) Emissions control equipment and diagnostic or malfunction
25	indicator systems, including microprocessor control systems, are not
26	present, intact, and operational; EXCEPT THAT THE RULES MUST NOT

1	PROHIBIT ISSUANCE OF A CERTIFICATION OF EMISSIONS COMPLIANCE
2	SOLELY BECAUSE A CHECK-ENGINE LIGHT IS ILLUMINATED ON A VEHICLE'S
3	DASHBOARD;
4	(B) if Repairs were not appropriate and did not address the reason
5	for the emissions failure; or
6	(C) if The vehicle emits visible smoke.
7	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-310, amend
8	(1)(b)(I)(C) and $(1)(b)(II)(B)$ as follows:
9	42-4-310. Periodic emissions control inspection required.
10	(1) (b) (I) (C) Effective May 28, 1999, 1982 and newer model motor
11	vehicles that are owned by the United States government or an agency
12	thereof or by the state of Colorado or any agency or political subdivision
13	thereof that would be registered in the program area shall be inspected
14	every two FOUR years, and shall be issued a certification of emissions
15	compliance that shall be IS valid for twenty-four FORTY-EIGHT months;
16	except that vehicles owned or operated by any agency or political
17	subdivision that is authorized and licensed pursuant to section 42-4-309
18	to inspect fleet vehicles shall be inspected annually.
19	(II) (B) 1982 and newer model motor vehicles required pursuant
20	to this section to have a certification of emissions control shall be
21	inspected at the time of the sale or transfer of any such vehicle and, prior
22	to registration renewal, shall be issued a certification of emissions control
23	that shall be IS valid for twenty-four FORTY-EIGHT months except as
24	provided under section 42-4-309. An inspection is not required prior to
25	the sale of a motor vehicle with at least twelve months remaining before
26	the vehicle's certification of emissions compliance expires if such THE
27	certification was issued when the vehicle was new. This

sub-subparagraph (B) SUBSECTION (1)(b)(II)(B) does not apply to the sale of a motor vehicle that is inoperable or otherwise cannot be tested in accordance with regulations RULES promulgated by the department of revenue if the seller of the motor vehicle provides a written notice to the purchaser pursuant to the requirements of subsection (4) of this section.

SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date - applicability. (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

(2) This act applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable effective date of this act.
