HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 18-1008	
CONCERNING RECOGNIZING THE POSITIVE IMPACTS OF ADAPTIVE	
SPORTS PROGRAMS ON VETERANS IN COLORADO.	
WHEREAS, Approximately 1,330,645 service members have been	
wounded in our nation's conflicts since World War I; and	
WHEREAS, The brave men and women who serve our country	
through the military often place their lives at great risk to ensure our	
continued freedom as United States citizens; and	
WHEREAS, Sadly, some of these brave service members of the	
United States armed forces are permanently injured while in service and	
must undergo extensive rehabilitation in order to rebuild their lives,	
regain independence, and maximize their quality of life; and

4 5 6	WHEREAS, More than 56.7 million individuals in the United States live with a disability, with more than 458,800 of those individuals residing in Colorado; and

11 12 13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, The diverse and awe-inspiring geography of Colorado allows for varied and unique opportunities for recreational therapy and adaptive sports, including but not limited to camping, outdoor climbing, wheelchair rugby, alpine skiing, wheelchair lacrosse, fishing, mountain biking, cross-country skiing, horseback riding, wheelchair basketball, hunting, and road biking; and
17 18 19 20	WHEREAS, The efforts to adapt athletic and recreational activities to those living with disabilities have led to the innovation, creation, and production of adaptive sports equipment, much of that equipment produced by leaders in the industry who are based here in Colorado; and

1	WHEREAS, Adaptive sports programs utilize the good will
2	abundant in Colorado's citizens and create the opportunity for more than
3	2,760 volunteers to serve nearly 103,991 hours annually; and
4	WHEREAS, While the positive social contributions of adaptive
5	sports programs are apparent, these organizations are also an economic
6	factor in the state of Colorado, with their combined annual budgets
7	totaling more than \$11.9 million; now, therefore,
8	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-first
9	General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:
10	That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly:
11	(1) Recognize the positive social and economic impact that
12	adaptive sports programs have in the state of Colorado;
13	(2) Commend the honorable work that adaptive sports programs
14	do in the service of our disabled veterans and the disabled community at

16	(3) Encourage our fellow Coloradans to support the work and
17	foster the continued growth of adaptive sports programs in the Centennial
18	State.
