Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$151,332 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2018-19. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.5 FTE. Of these funds, \$80,000 is reappropriated to the Governor's Office of Information Technology for technology services and \$15,984 is reappropriated to the Department of Law for legal services.
