Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides a total of \$151,332 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2018-19. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.5 FTE. Of these funds, \$80,000 is reappropriated to the Governor's Office of Information Technology for technology services and \$15,984 is reappropriated to the Department of Law for legal services.
