This bill directs the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) to adopt rules regarding the use of distributed energy storage systems by customers of Colorado's investor-owned utilities. It will result in a one-time workload increase for PUC staff

in FY 2018-19.

## **Summary of Legislation**

The bill directs the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) to adopt rules governing the installation, interconnection, and use of customer-sited distributed energy storage systems. The bill defines energy storage system and specifies principles that are to be incorporated into the rules, including that:

- the installation and use of customer-sited energy storage systems is in the public
- consumers may install these systems without the burden of unnecessary regulations or discriminatory fees;
- · utility approval processes for these systems must be simple, streamlined, and affordable: and
- utilities may not require customer-sited meters to monitor these systems, except as authorized by the PUC in certain circumstances.

### **State Expenditures**

In FY 2018-19, this bill will result in a one-time workload increase for PUC staff in the Department of Regulatory Agencies to adopt rules concerning customer-sited energy storage systems. The rulemaking scope is limited and can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

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#### **Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 22, 2018, and takes effect August 8, 2018, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
