This bill creates a legislative interim committee to study misdemeanor sentencing. This bill increases state expenditures and workload and local government workload in FY 2018-19 only.

**Appropriation Summary:** For FY 2018-19 this bill requires an appropriation of \$30,515 to the Legislative Department.

**Fiscal Note Status:** This revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

**Summary of Legislation**

This bill creates the Legislative Interim Committee on Misdemeanor Sentencing consisting of six members, three from the House of Representatives and three from the Senate. This committee must hold its first meeting by July 1, 2018, and is authorized to meet up to five times to study:

- collateral consequences of a crime with a sentencing range of a year or greater;
- the fiscal impact of misdemeanor sentences on state and local authorities; and
- the appropriate penalty level for misdemeanor offenses.

The committee is authorized to introduce up to five bills in the 2019 legislative session.

**State Expenditures**

For FY 2018-19 only, this bill increases Legislative Department costs by \$35,968 and 0.4 FTE. Judicial Department workload may also increase. These impacts are shown in Table 2 and discussed below.

\* Centrally appropriated costs are not included in the bill's appropriation.

**Legislative Department.** To provide staffing for this interim committee, 0.4 FTE is needed in FY 2018-19 only. This is for 0.3 FTE for Legislative Council Staff to staff the committee and to conduct research and fiscal analysis and 0.1 FTE for Office of Legislative Legal Services staff to draft legislation and provide legal research. This assumes a starting date of July 1, 2018. FY 2018-19 costs are prorated based on the general fund payday shift. Travel and per diem costs for six legislators estimated at \$218.50 per meeting, for five meetings.

**Judicial Department.** Workload in the Judicial Department may increase in FY 2018-19 only, to provide information related to state misdemeanor sentencing impacts and collateral consequences. This increase is considered minimal and can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

**Local Government**

For FY 2018-19 only, this bill may increase local government workload for municipalities, counties, and local law enforcement to provide information to this interim committee regarding misdemeanor sentencing impacts and collateral consequences. This impact is considered to be minimal.

**Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

**State Appropriations**

For FY 2018-19, this bill requires an appropriation of \$30,515 General Fund to the Legislative Department as follows:

- \$16,879 and 0.3 FTE to the Legislative Council Staff;
- \$7,081 and 0.1 FTE to the Office of Legislative Legal Services; and
- \$6,555 to the General Assembly for travel reimbursement and per diem.
