**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING ALLOWING EACH PARENTAL GUARDIAN TO SERVE AS A**  
102 **MINOR MEDICAL MARIJUANA PATIENT'S PRIMARY CAREGIVER.**

**Bill Summary**

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, a medical marijuana patient is limited to having one primary caregiver at a time. The bill makes an exception for a patient who is under 18 years of age and allows each parent or guardian to serve as a primary caregiver.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-1.5-106, **amend**  
3 (8)(b) as follows:

4 **25-1.5-106. Medical marijuana program - powers and duties**  
5 **of state health agency - rules - medical review board - medical**  
6 **marijuana program cash fund - subaccount - created - "Ethan's**  
7 **Law" - repeal. (8) Patient - primary caregiver relationship. (b) (I) A**  
8 patient ~~shall~~ MAY have only one primary caregiver at any given time;  
9 EXCEPT THAT A PATIENT WHO IS UNDER EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE MAY  
10 HAVE EACH PARENT OR GUARDIAN TO ACT AS A PRIMARY CAREGIVER.

11 (II) THE SHORT TITLE OF THIS SUBSECTION (8)(b) IS "ETHAN'S  
12 LAW".

13 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
14 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
15 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August  
16 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3, 2019); except that, if a  
17 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
18 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
19 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect  
20 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
21 November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
22 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
