A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE AUTHORITY OF TRIBAL ENTITIES TO ADMINISTER

FINGERPRINT-BASED CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS

RELATED TO EMERGENCY CHILD WELFARE PLACEMENTS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under existing law, a county department of human or social services and a local law enforcement agency are authorized to conduct certain fingerprint-based criminal history record checks related to emergency child welfare placements and receive records related to those record checks. The bill includes a department or division of human or

social services of an Indian tribe in the definition of county department and includes a law enforcement agency of an Indian tribe in the definition of local law enforcement agency for the purpose of conducting, and receiving records related to, fingerprint-based criminal history record checks related to emergency child welfare placements.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 19-3-406, amend (6) 3 as follows: 4 19-3-406. Fingerprint-based criminal history record check -5 providers of emergency placement for children - use of criminal 6 justice records - definitions - rules. (6) For purposes of this section, 7 UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES: "initial criminal history 8 record check" means a name-based state and federal criminal history 9 record check performed by a local law enforcement agency utilizing the 10 records of the Colorado bureau of investigation and the federal bureau of 11 investigation. 12 (a) "COUNTY DEPARTMENT" INCLUDES A DEPARTMENT OR DIVISION 13 OF HUMAN OR SOCIAL SERVICES OF AN INDIAN TRIBE. 14 "INITIAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK" MEANS A 15 NAME-BASED STATE AND FEDERAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK 16 PERFORMED BY A LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY UTILIZING THE 17 RECORDS OF THE COLORADO BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND THE 18 FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION. "LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY" INCLUDES A LAW 19 20 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OF AN INDIAN TRIBE. 21 **SECTION 2.** Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
