**Sunset Process - State, Veterans, and Military Affairs Committee.** The bill continues the Colorado human trafficking council until September 1, 2024.

1           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-3-505, **amend**  
2 (1)(b)(XX), (1)(b)(XXII), (2), (3), (4)(f), and (6); repeal (4)(a)(I); and  
3 **add (1)(b)(XXIV) and (1)(b)(XXV)** as follows:

4           **18-3-505. Human trafficking council - created - duties - repeal.**  
5 (1) (b) The membership of the council must reflect, to the extent  
6 possible, representation of urban and rural areas of the state and a balance  
7 of expertise, both governmental and nongovernmental, in issues relating  
8 to human trafficking. The council must include members with expertise  
9 in child welfare and human services to address the unique needs of child  
10 victims, including those child victims who are involved in the child  
11 welfare system. The membership of the council consists of the following  
12 persons, appointed as follows:

13           (XX) ~~Two~~ FOUR persons who are former victims of human  
14 trafficking, ~~one~~ TWO who ~~is a~~ ARE former ~~victim~~ VICTIMS of human  
15 trafficking for involuntary servitude and ~~one~~ TWO who ~~is a~~ ARE former  
16 ~~victim~~ VICTIMS of human trafficking for sexual servitude, each to be  
17 appointed by the governor or his or her designee;

18           (XXII) One person to be appointed by the commissioner of  
19 agriculture; and

20           (XXIV) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A STATEWIDE COALITION FOR  
21 VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, TO BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR OR  
22 HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; AND

23           (XXV) ONE PERSON WHO IS A REPRESENTATIVE OF AN  
24 ORGANIZATION FOR VICTIMS OF LABOR TRAFFICKING OR AN INDIVIDUAL  
25 WHO HAS EXTENSIVE PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE IN ADVOCATING FOR  
26 VICTIMS OF LABOR TRAFFICKING, TO BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR OR  
27 HIS OR HER DESIGNEE.

1 (2) Each appointing authority described in subsection (1) of this  
2 section shall make his or her appointments to the council on or before  
3 August 1, 2014. THE TERM OF A COUNCIL MEMBER SERVING AS OF THE  
4 EFFECTIVE DATE OF SENATE BILL 19-149, ENACTED IN 2019, OR ANY  
5 COUNCIL MEMBER APPOINTED AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF SENATE BILL  
6 19-149, ENACTED IN 2019, WILL EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31 OF THE YEAR  
7 THE TERM IS SET TO EXPIRE. THE SUCCEEDING APPOINTEE'S TERM WILL  
8 COMMENCE ON THE JANUARY 1 FOLLOWING THE EXPIRATION OF THE  
9 PRECEDING TERM. The members of the council shall elect presiding  
10 officers for the council, including a chair and vice-chair, from among the  
11 council members appointed pursuant to subsection (1) of this section,  
12 which presiding officers shall serve terms of two years. Council members  
13 may reelect a presiding officer.

14 (3) (a) ~~Each member of the council shall~~ EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY  
15 SUBSECTION (3)(b) OF THIS SECTION, EACH COUNCIL MEMBER MUST serve  
16 at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority for a term of four years.  
17 The appointing authority may reappoint the COUNCIL member for an  
18 additional term or terms. ~~Members of the council shall~~ COUNCIL  
19 MEMBERS MUST serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for  
20 actual travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

21 (b) EACH COUNCIL MEMBER APPOINTED PURSUANT TO  
22 SUBSECTIONS (1)(b)(I) TO (1)(b)(IV), (1)(b)(XXII), AND (1)(b)(XXIII) OF  
23 THIS SECTION AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF SENATE BILL 19-149,  
24 ENACTED IN 2019, MUST SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF HIS OR HER  
25 APPOINTING AUTHORITY FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS. THE APPOINTING  
26 AUTHORITY MAY REAPPOINT THE COUNCIL MEMBER FOR AN ADDITIONAL  
27 TERM OR TERMS. COUNCIL MEMBERS MUST SERVE WITHOUT

1        COMPENSATION BUT MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR ACTUAL TRAVEL EXPENSES  
2        INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES.

3                (4) The council shall hold its first meeting on or before November  
4        1, 2014, at a time and place to be designated by the executive director of  
5        the department of public safety, or by his or her designee. The council  
6        shall meet at least four times each year and shall carry out the following  
7        duties:

8                (a) On or before January 1, 2016, make recommendations to the  
9        judiciary committees of the house of representatives and senate, or any  
10       successor committees, concerning:

11               (I) ~~Whether the general assembly should establish standards and~~  
12       ~~a process for the certification of organizations that provide services to~~  
13       ~~victims of human trafficking;~~

14               (f) Identify best practices for the prevention of ALL FORMS OF  
15       human trafficking, particularly for the prevention of INCLUDING BUT NOT  
16       LIMITED TO child sex trafficking AND INVOLUNTARY SERVITUDE  
17       TRAFFICKING;

18               (6) This section is repealed, effective ~~September 1, 2019~~  
19       SEPTEMBER 1, 2024. Before repeal, the department of regulatory agencies  
20       shall review the council pursuant to section 2-3-1203. ~~C.R.S.~~

21               **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, **repeal**  
22       (9)(a)(V); and **add** (15)(a)(VI) as follows:

23               **2-3-1203. Sunset review of advisory committees - legislative**  
24       **declaration - definition - repeal.** (9) (a) The following statutory  
25       authorizations for the designated advisory committees will repeal on  
26       September 1, 2019:

6 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
7 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
8 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
