Bill Topic: URBAN DRAINAGE FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT BOARD DIRECTORS

Summary of Fiscal Impact: **No fiscal impact.** This bill repeals statutory requirements regarding the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District board of directors size and meeting time frames. This bill does not impact the costs or workload of the district and has been assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

This bill repeals the requirements that the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District board of directors must be 16 members and that the board must meet on the first business day of February each year. The bill also relocates the oath that each board member must take to a different section of statute.

Background

The UDFCD was formed in 1969 to design and construct flood control and warning measures, open space, regional pathways, and remove trash and debris from streams. The district covers parts of seven Denver metro area counties. The UDFCD has 22 appointed board members, however only 18 members receive compensation. The board meets 10 times per year.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

This bill has been assessed as having no fiscal impact. This bill does not change the number of Urban Drainage and Flood Control District board members or change the number of board meetings that will be held annually; therefore, this bill does not impact the costs or workload of the district.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 2, 2019, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 3, 2019, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
