Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill grants a board of county commissioners the authority to license and regulate any business located or business activity occurring within the county, including short-term lodging rentals or advertising for such rentals, and to fix the fees, terms, and manner for issuing and revoking licenses issued therefor.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 30-15-401, add (1)(s)
3 as follows:

30-15-401. General regulations - definitions. (1) In addition to
those powers granted by sections 30-11-101 and 30-11-107 and by parts
1, 2, and 3 of this article 15, the board of county commissioners may
adopt ordinances for control or licensing of those matters of purely local
concern that are described in the following enumerated powers:

9 (s) (I) TO LICENSE AND REGULATE AN OWNER OR OWNER'S AGENT 10 WHO RENTS OR ADVERTISES THE OWNER'S LODGING UNIT FOR A 11 SHORT-TERM STAY, AND TO FIX THE FEES, TERMS, AND MANNER FOR 12 ISSUING AND REVOKING LICENSES ISSUED THEREFOR. AS USED IN THIS 13 SUBSECTION (1)(s)(I), "OWNER'S AGENT" DOES NOT INCLUDE AN INTERNET 14 HOSPITALITY SERVICE.

(II) THE LICENSING OR REGULATION UNDER THE AUTHORITY
CONFERRED IN SUBSECTION (1)(s)(I) OF THIS SECTION DOES NOT AFFECT
WHETHER A LODGING UNIT IS A RESIDENTIAL IMPROVEMENT, AS DEFINED
IN SECTION 39-1-102 (14.3).

19 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 20 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 21 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 22 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a 23 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 24 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 25 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 26 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in

- 1 November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 2 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
