Sunset Process - House Public Health Care and Human Services Committee. The bill implements the recommendation of the department of regulatory agencies' sunset review and report on the nurse-physician advisory task force for Colorado health care (NPATCH) by continuing the NPATCH indefinitely.

11	SECTION 3. Appropriation. For the 2020-21 state fiscal year,
12	\$15,554 is appropriated to the department of regulatory agencies for use
13	by the division of professions and occupations. This appropriation is from
14	the division of professions and occupations cash fund created in section
15	12-20-105 (3), C.R.S., and is based on an assumption that the division
16	will require an additional 0.2 FTE. To implement this act, the division
17	may use this appropriation for personal services.
18	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds.
19	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
