Bill Summary

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-43.7-107, amend 3 (2) as follows: 4 22-43.7-107. Public school facility construction guidelines -5 establishment by board - use. (2) The public school facility 6 construction guidelines shall MUST identify and describe the capital 7 construction, renovation, and equipment needs in public school facilities 8 and means of addressing those needs that will provide educational and 9 safety benefits at a reasonable cost. 20	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act				
21	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the

24	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
