A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE REPEAL OF THE PROGRAM TO INCREASE PUBLIC
102 AWARENESS OF OPIOID USE IMPLEMENTED BY THE CENTER FOR
103 RESEARCH INTO SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER PREVENTION,
104 TREATMENT, AND RECOVERY SUPPORT STRATEGIES, AND, IN
105 CONNECTION THEREWITH, REPEALING THE REQUIREMENT FOR
106 APPROPRIATIONS TO THE CENTER FOR THE PROGRAM,
107 ELIMINATING THE SCHEDULED SUNSET REVIEW OF THE
108 PROGRAM, AND REDUCING AN APPROPRIATION.

Joint Budget Committee. Current law requires appropriations of \$750,000 for state fiscal years 2019-20 through 2023-24 from the marijuana tax cash fund to the center for research into substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery support strategies to implement a program to increase public awareness concerning the safe use, storage, and disposal of opioids and the availability of naloxone and other drugs used to block the effects of an opioid overdose. The bill repeals the requirement for state fiscal years 2020-21 through 2023-24 and repeals the program, effective September 1, 2020. The bill also repeals the scheduled sunset review of the program prior to its repeal.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-80-118, **amend**
3 (5)(b) as follows:

4 **27-80-118. Center for research into substance use disorder**
5 **prevention, treatment, and recovery support strategies - legislative**
6 **declaration - established - repeal.** (5) (b) (I) For the 2019-20 STATE
7 fiscal year, ~~and each fiscal year thereafter through the 2023-24 fiscal year,~~
8 the general assembly shall appropriate seven hundred fifty thousand
9 dollars ~~per year~~ to the center from the marijuana tax cash fund created in
10 section 39-28.8-501 (1) for the purposes of this subsection (5).

11 (II) This subsection (5) is repealed, effective ~~September 1, 2024.~~
12 ~~Before its repeal, the program created in this subsection (5) is scheduled~~
13 ~~for review pursuant to section 24-34-104 SEPTEMBER 1, 2020.~~

14 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, **repeal**
15 (25)(a)(XX) as follows:

16 **24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies**
17 **and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative**
18 **declaration - repeal.** (25) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both,
19 are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2024:

5 **SECTION 3. Appropriation - adjustments to 2020 long bill.** To
6 implement this act, the cash funds appropriation from the marijuana tax
7 cash fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S., made in the annual
8 general appropriation act for the 2020-21 state fiscal year to the
9 department of higher education for use by the regents of the university of
10 Colorado is decreased by \$750,000.

11 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
12 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
