Executive Committee of the Legislative Council. The bill suspends legislative interim committee activities during the 2020 interim. Specifically, the bill:

Prohibits the legislative council of the general assembly L from prioritizing any requests for legislative interim committees, including task forces, for the 2020 interim; and İ. Prohibits meetings, field trips, and legislative recommendations and reports by, and suspends for one year certain reports required to be submitted to, existing legislative interim committees, including the Colorado youth advisory council review committee; wildfire matters review committee; statewide health care review committee; Colorado health insurance exchange oversight committee; pension review commission and pension review subcommittee; early childhood and school readiness legislative commission; water resources review committee; and transportation legislation review committee.

Additionally, the bill removes the requirement that the early childhood and school readiness legislative commission meet at least 4 times each year and instead limits the commission to up to 4 meetings per year.

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-303.3, add (3)(d)

3 as follows:

Interim committees repeal. _ 5 (3) (d) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, THE 6 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SHALL NOT PRIORITIZE ANY INTERIM COMMITTEES 7 OR APPROVE ANY TASK FORCES FOR THE 2020 INTERIM. NOTHING IN THIS 8 SUBSECTION (3)(d) PROHIBITS THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE 9 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, WHETHER BEFORE OR AFTER THE GENERAL 10 ASSEMBLY HAS ADJOURNED, FROM APPROVING AN INTERIM COMMITTEE BY 11 RESOLUTION FOR THE 2020 INTERIM IN THE MANNER SPECIFIED IN 12 SUBSECTION (3)(c) OF THIS SECTION.

(5) (a) The review committee may meet up to three times during
each interim but may not travel unless authorized by the executive
committee of the legislative council. A majority of voting members
constitutes a quorum.

The committee shall meet at the call 16 of the chair at least once during the interim of each year to review and to 17 propose legislation or other policy changes relating to wildfire prevention 18 and mitigation and all related matters, including, without limitation, 19 public safety, forest health, and cooperation with appropriate federal 20 agencies and local governments. The committee may take up to two field 21 trips during the interim and consult with experts in all fields relating to 22 wildfire prevention and mitigation as may be necessary to achieve the 23 objectives of this part 16. All personnel of any state agency or political 24 subdivision of Colorado involved in wildfire prevention and mitigation, 25 including the Colorado department of public safety and the Colorado state 26 forest service, shall cooperate with the committee and with any persons 27 assisting the committee in carrying out its duties pursuant to this section.

10-16-221. Statewide health care review committee - creation
- membership - duties - repeal. (3) (a) The committee shall meet no
more than two times each legislative interim, unless additional meetings
are authorized by the executive committee of the legislative council. Of

the meetings authorized under this subsection (3), the committee may take
 up to two field trips per year in connection with its duties mandated under
 this section.

The committee 16 shall meet on or before August 1, 2011, and thereafter at the call of the chair at least two times during each calendar year, but no more than seven 17 18 times during each calendar year when the general assembly is not in 19 session. The committee may meet an unlimited number of times at the call 20 of the chair when the general assembly is in session. The committee may 21 use the legislative council staff to assist its members in researching any 22 matters.

The commission shall study issues 5 concerning early childhood and school readiness, including but not 6 limited to health care, mental health, parental involvement, family 7 support, child care, and early learning. The commission shall solicit input 8 from members of the public, especially those individuals with expertise 9 related to early childhood and school readiness issues, to aid the 10 commission in its work. The commission shall consult with the early 11 childhood leadership commission, created in section 26-6.2-103, with 12 regard to policies concerning early childhood and school readiness.

The committee shall meet at the call of the chair as often as 13 six times during even-numbered years and eight times during 14 odd-numbered years to review and to propose water resources legislation 15 and matters relating thereto. No more than two of such meetings may 16 occur during periods other than the interim period; except that the 17 committee shall not meet during the 2010 interim period WHILE THE 18 GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS IN SESSION. In connection with such review, except 19 during the 2010 interim period, the committee may take up to two field 20 trips per year in connection with its mandate and shall consult with 21 experts in the field of water conservation, quality, use, finance, and 22 development. The department of natural resources, the state engineer, and 23 the attorney general, together with the members and staff of the Colorado 24 water conservation board, the Colorado water resources and power 25 development authority, the Colorado water quality control commission, 26 the department of public health and environment, the department of agriculture, and the great outdoors Colorado program, shall cooperate 27

with the committee and with any persons assisting the committee in
 pursuing its responsibilities pursuant to this section. Further, the
 committee may utilize the legislative council staff to assist its members

Such greater number shall not exceed one bill or other 21 measure per member.
