lieu of this amount, members who do not reside in the Denver metropolitan area are entitled to an amount equal to 85% of the federal per diem rate for the city and county of Denver, which is \$219 for the 2019-2020 fiscal year. The bill freezes the amount to be paid to members who do not reside in the Denver metropolitan area to this current amount for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-2-317, amend 3 (1)(b)(II) as follows: 4 2-2-317. Expense, subsistence, and travel allowance -5 **definition.** (1) (b) (II) In lieu of the expenses allowed in paragraph (a) of 6 this subsection (1) SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION, if a member does 7 not reside in the Denver metropolitan area, which area shall be designated 8 in guidelines established by the executive committee of legislative 9 council, the member shall be entitled to receive per legislative day for 10 expenses incurred during the sessions of the general assembly up to an 11 amount equal to THE FOLLOWING: 12 (A) FOR FISCAL YEARS COMMENCING PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2020, AND 13 ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2021, eighty-five percent of the federal per diem 14 rate for the city and county of Denver, rounded up to the nearest whole 15 dollar, as determined by the United States general services administration, 16 or such succeeding entity, as of October 1 of the calendar year 17 immediately preceding the fiscal year in which the per diem rate is to be 18 used; AND 19 (B) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JULY 1, 2020, 20 EIGHTY-FIVE PERCENT OF THE FEDERAL PER DIEM RATE FOR THE CITY AND 21 COUNTY OF DENVER, ROUNDED UP TO THE NEAREST WHOLE DOLLAR, AS 22 DETERMINED BY THE UNITED STATES GENERAL SERVICES
