Bill Topic: REPEAL COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT YOUTH SERVICES STATUTES

Summary of Fiscal Impact: No fiscal impact. The bill repeals statutory language requiring the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment to provide youth services that were previously transferred to the Department of Human Services. The bill conforms state statute with current practice, and therefore has no impact on state or local government revenue or expenditures.

Summary of Legislation

Summary:

House Bill 13-1117 transferred certain youth service functions from the Department of Public health and Environment to the Department of Human Services. This bill repeals statutory language that requires the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment to provide those previously transferred youth services.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill conforms state statute with current practice and therefore is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 5, 2020, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 6, 2020, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
