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Bill Topic: TRASH COLLECTION BY SPECIAL DISTRICTS Summary of □ State Revenue TABOR Refund □ State Expenditure **Fiscal Impact:** □ State Transfer □ Statutory Public Entity The bill allows a special sanitation district to provide trash collection services in any county. The bill may minimally increase local government expenditures and revenue. **Appropriation** No appropriation is required. **Summary:** The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. **Fiscal Note** Status:

Summary of Legislation

The bill allows a sanitation or water district in any county to collect and transport solid waste, including residential trash collection, and to charge fees for these services to district residents. Under current law, this authority is only for districts with a resident elector population of no more than 2,500, located in whole or in part in counties with a total population of no more than 25,000.

Local Government

Under current law, a special sanitation district, or a sanitation and water district may only provide trash collection in roughly 42 of 64 Colorado counties. This bill allows trash collection in any county. Assuming at least one special sanitation district chooses to provide services, administrative expenditures and related user fees are increased.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 5, 2020, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 6, 2020, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
