The bill would have established that a reduction in water usage due to an efficiency project does not constitute abandonment of a water right. It would have increased state workload on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation was required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. The bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

Current law recognizes certain activities that can result in a reduction in water use without constituting abandonment of a water right. The bill adds the implementation of an efficiency improvement project to this list. When determining abandonment, any nonuse resulting from such a project is not counted for a period of up to 20 years. Written notice must be submitted to the Division of Water Resources in the Department of Natural Resources within one year of the project being implemented.

State Expenditures

The bill increases workload for the Division of Water Resources to develop a form and review any submitted forms. This minimal workload can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Rural Affairs and Agriculture Committee on March 2, 2020.
