Bill Topic: **SALE AND TRANSPORT OF FIREWORKS EXPORTER LICENSE**

Summary of Fiscal Impact: **No fiscal impact.** This bill allows individuals with a valid driver's license and a valid wholesale, retail, or resale license from any state to transport fireworks purchased in Colorado from a licensed exporter of fireworks.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, a person or manufacturer who furnishes fireworks for export outside the state is licensed as a fireworks exporter by the Division of Fire Prevention and Control in the Department of Public Safety (DPS). Fireworks exporters may sell fireworks to a customer and allow the purchaser to transport the fireworks in a private vehicle if the customer has a valid driver's license and vehicle registration from another state, or has a valid driver's license issued by Colorado and a valid wholesale or retail license issued by a governing body outside of Colorado.

This bill allows an exporter to sell fireworks for transport if the purchaser displays a valid driver's license and a valid wholesale or retail license number, or a resale license number, regardless of the issuing state.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill clarifies the conditions for a business transaction between licensed parties. The bill does not change the revenue, expenditures, or workload of the DPS, or any other state agency or local government. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Transportation and Energy Committee on May 26, 2020.
