Summary of Legislation

House Bill 20-1377, if passed, will set aside up to \$49 million generated by the issuance of certificates of participation to be used for controlled maintenance projects, including capital renewal projects. House Bill 20-1408 establishes a prioritized list of these projects to be funded.

State Expenditures

Assuming that the maximum amount of \$49 million anticipated from the passage of HB 20-1377 is credited to the Capital Construction Fund, the bill appropriates money to the following departments:

Funding all these projects leaves \$8,255,430 for the Emergency Controlled Maintenance Account.

Effective Date

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on July 10, 2020.

State Appropriations

For FY 2020-21, the bill includes appropriations of up to \$49 million from the Capital Construction Fund to various state departments. No further appropriation is required.
