This bill extends the Legislative Oversight Committee Concerning the Treatment of Persons with Mental Health Disorders in the Criminal and Juvenile Justice Systems and the associated task force until July 1, 2023. It will increase state expenditures and potentially state revenue starting in FY 2021-22.

Summary of Legislation

This bill extends the repeal date for the Legislative Oversight Committee Concerning the Treatment of Persons with Mental Health Disorders in the Criminal and Juvenile Justice Systems and its associated task force until July 1, 2023. The committee is prohibited from meeting during the 2020 interim or any interim in which interim committees are suspended. The committee is not required to fulfill any statutory requirements when interim committees are suspended. The task force is not required to meet, to submit annual policy and legislative recommendations, or an annual report to the committee during the 2020 interim or any interim in which interim committees are suspended.

State Revenue

The bill potentially increases state revenue from gifts, grants, and donations but no source of gifts, grants, or donations has been identified at this time.

State Expenditures

The bill increases General Fund expenditures by \$8,698 in FY 2021-22 for committee and task force reimbursement as shown in Table 2 and explained below.

Legislative Department. Reimbursement for oversight committee members assumes three meetings with per diem of \$111.23 and \$124.00 travel for six members. Reimbursement of expenses for three eligible task force members assumes \$124.00 per member for twelve meetings.

Other participating agencies. A number of agencies are required to participate in the task force. These agencies can accomplish this increased workload within existing appropriations.

Local Government

The bill requires participation from a number of local governments and agencies. This workload increase can be accomplished within existing resources.

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Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
