The bill would have allowed the Office of Information Technology to hire additional staff for state government projects. It would have increased state expenditures on an ongoing basis.

**Appropriation Summary:** No appropriation in required.

**Fiscal Note Status:** The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill, as recommended by the Joint Technology Committee. This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

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## Summary of Legislation

The bill allows the Office of Information Technology to recruit and hire information technology managers, designers, engineers, and other staff to support the delivery of citizen-facing digital services and other projects across state government.

## State Expenditures

Hiring additional staff will create additional workload and expenditures in the Office of Information Technology. Any potential expenditures will be handled through the annual budget process and no change in appropriations in required.

## Effective Date

This bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate State, Veterans, and Military Affairs Committee on May 27, 2020.
