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Bill Topic: PROFESSIONAL FIRE FIGHTERS LICENSE PLATE ENTITY

Summary of Fiscal Impact: **No fiscal impact.** This bill would have made changes to the qualifications for the Colorado Professional Firefighters group special license plate. It was assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation was required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, applicants for the Colorado Professional Firefighters group special license plate must give a donation to a designated Colorado nonprofit organization as determined by the Colorado Department of Revenue. In order to qualify as a designated Colorado nonprofit organization, the organization must have been in existence for at least 20 years. This bill lowers this requirement to 15 years. In addition, the bill requires that the designated Colorado nonprofit organization include a signed affidavit that the organization has at least 3,000 members residing in Colorado.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The General Assembly created the Colorado Professional Firefighters group special license plate in 2019. To date, only one organization is anticipated to meet some of the requirements to qualify as the designated Colorado nonprofit organization to receive donations. As the bill only changes the requirements related to the Colorado nonprofit organization and not the issuance of license plates, the bill will result in no change to state revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Transportation and Energy Committee on May 26, 2020.
