## AN ACT

**CONCERNING THE PROHIBITION OF INDICATING AN ASSESSMENT SCORE ON A STUDENT'S HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT.**

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

**SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1016, **amend** (2) as follows:

**22-7-1016. Assessments in high school - transcripts - definition.** (2) (a) Each high school student's final transcript ~~shall~~ **MUST** describe the student's level of postsecondary and workforce readiness by

~~(a)~~ indicating the student's level of performance in the postsecondary and workforce readiness program. ~~and~~

(b) (I) ~~Indicating~~ **NOTWITHSTANDING ANY GRADUATION REQUIREMENT ADOPTED BY A LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER, EACH HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT'S TRANSCRIPT MUST NOT INDICATE the student's level of performance on the A readiness assessments ASSESSMENT administered to the student pursuant to section 22-7-1006.3 in high school OR ON A NATIONAL ASSESSMENT.**

(II) **FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (2)(b), "NATIONAL ASSESSMENT" MEANS ANY ASSESSMENT THAT IS ADMINISTERED THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES TO MEASURE POSTSECONDARY OR WORKFORCE READINESS.**

**SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
