A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL**
102 **AFFAIRS FOR THE RURAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE**
103 **GRANT PROGRAM.**

Bill Summary

In 2020, the Colorado general assembly created the rural economic development initiative (REDI) grant program in the department of local affairs (department). The department, in consultation with the office of economic development, may provide grants to a new employer or the expansion of an existing employer and for projects that create diversity

and resiliency in the local economies of rural communities. Or, if the department determines that a rural community needs resources or assistance because it has been impacted by a significant economic event or an anticipated event that has been announced, the department may use all or a portion of the money appropriated for the REDI grant program for the purposes of the "Rural Economic Advancement of Colorado Towns (REACT) Act".

Section 2 of the bill appropriates \$5 million to the department for the REDI grant program. **Section 1** ensures that the department will use all of this appropriation for the purposes of the grants or REACT.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-32-128, **amend** (6)(a); and **add** (6)(c) as follows:

24-32-128. Rural economic development initiative grant program - creation - report - definitions. (6) (a) Any appropriation ~~in an annual general appropriation act~~ for REDI program grants must be administered in accordance with this section. Except as provided in ~~subsection (4)~~ SUBSECTIONS (4) AND (6)(c) of this section, the entire amount of such appropriation must be used for REDI program grants.

(c) THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS MAY USE UP TO THREE AND SEVENTY-FIVE ONE-HUNDREDTHS PERCENT OF THE APPROPRIATION IN SENATE BILL 21-204, ENACTED IN 2021, FOR ANY DIRECT AND INDIRECT ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES RELATED TO THE REDI PROGRAM GRANTS THAT ARE AWARDED FROM THE APPROPRIATION.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 24-32-3605 as follows:

24-32-3605. Repeal of part. ~~This part 36 is repealed, effective September 1, 2021.~~

SECTION 3. Appropriation. For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$5,000,000 is appropriated to the department of local affairs. This

1 appropriation is from the general fund. The department may use this
2 appropriation for the rural economic development initiative grant
3 program. Any money appropriated in this section not expended prior to
4 July 1, 2022, is further appropriated to the department for the 2022-23
5 state fiscal year for the same purpose.

6 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
7 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
8 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
