Joint Budget Committee. The bill repeals the state recovery audit program, effective July 1, 2022, and reduces the state fiscal year 2021-22 general fund appropriation to the department of personnel for use by financial operations and reporting for personal services by \$64,714 and the related FTE by 1.0 FTE.







Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-30-203.5, add 3 (10) as follows: 4 24-30-203.5. Recovery audits - legislative declaration -5 contracting - reporting - definitions - repeal. (10) THIS SECTION IS 6 REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022. SECTION 2. Appropriation - adjustments to 2021 long bill. To 7 8 implement this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual 9 general appropriation act for the 2021-22 state fiscal year to the 10 department of personnel for use by financial operations and reporting for 11 personal services is decreased by \$64,714, and the related FTE is 12 decreased by 1.0 FTE. 13 SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, 14 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate

15 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
