The bill allows all members of a board of education of a school district to receive compensation and reimbursement for expenses, which may increase school district expenditures in future years.

**Appropriation Summary:**                    No appropriation is required.

## Summary of Legislation

The bill allows all elected school board members to receive compensation and reimbursement of expenses. Compensation for elected or appointed school board members:

- may not exceed \$150 per day for not more than five days of service per week, excluding federal and state holidays;
- can be adjusted in future years for inflation;
- must be set through a written resolution adopted by the board in a public meeting; and
- may not be changed for a board member during his or her elected or appointed term.

## School District

Under current law, school boards may only compensate and reimburse officers of the board, who may also be an elected member of the board. The president and vice president of the board may not be paid or reimbursed. By expanding the authority of school boards to provide compensation and reimbursements to all elected school board members, the bill may increase school district costs in the future. This cost has not been estimated and will depend on market compensation rates and future decisions by locally elected school boards.

## Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and it took effect on May 17, 2021.
