The House Appropriations Committee Report (05/18/21) includes amendments to the bill, however, Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that the committee amendments do not change the fiscal impact of the bill.

Table 3 of the revised fiscal note dated 05/14/21 identifies technology expenditures as \$298,478, whereas the fiscal note identifies the appropriation necessary for these expenditures as \$283,896. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that \$283,896 is the correct appropriation, and that the appropriation for operating expenses should be increased by \$14,582.

Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates a total of \$480,939 cash funds from the Stationary Sources Control Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment, and reappropriating \$12,761 to the Department of Law and \$283,896 to the Governor's Office of Information Technology for FY 2021-22. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Public Health and Environment will require an additional 1.2 FTE and the Department of Law will require an additional 0.1 FTE.

Points to Consider*Future Fiscal Impact*

Although this bill does not require a General Fund appropriation for FY 2021-22, it will require an appropriation of \$800,000 General Fund in FY 2022-23.
