Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill amends the appropriations included in S.B. 21-196 (the annual legislative appropriation bill), increasing General Fund appropriations for use by the General Assembly for FY 2021-22 by \$617,348 and increasing the related FTE by 70.0.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$50.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$617,348 for FY 2021-22, reducing the \$50.0 million set aside by the same amount.
