A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING COMPLAINTS RELATED TO A PERSON'S AUTHORIZATION**
102 **TO PRACTICE AN OCCUPATION FOR ACTS COMMITTED WHILE**
103 **THE PERSON IS SERVING IN AN OFFICIAL CAPACITY.**

Bill Summary

The bill directs the agency that regulates an occupation to dismiss a complaint that is lodged against the holder of an occupational license, certification, or registration if the complaint is based on words said or actions taken as:

- Colorado; or
- A member of a board or commission of Colorado or a political subdivision of Colorado.

The subject of the complaint need not respond or provide evidence for the complaint to be dismissed.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-20-403, **add** (5)
3 as follows:

4 **12-20-403. Disciplinary procedures - investigations - hearings**
5 **- oaths - witness statements - subpoenas - appointment of**
6 **administrative law judge - driver's history - acting as an official.**

7 (5) (a) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (5)(d) OF THIS SECTION, A
8 REGULATOR SHALL DISMISS AN ANONYMOUS COMPLAINT MADE AGAINST
9 A LICENSEE, CERTIFICANT, OR REGISTRANT IF THE BASIS FOR THE
10 ANONYMOUS COMPLAINT ARISES FROM WORDS SAID OR FROM ACTIONS
11 COMMITTED WHILE THE LICENSEE, CERTIFICANT, OR REGISTRANT WAS
12 ENGAGED IN OFFICIAL DUTIES AS:

13 (I) AN ELECTED OFFICIAL OF THE STATE OF COLORADO OR OF A
14 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF COLORADO; OR

15 (II) A MEMBER OF A BOARD OR COMMISSION ESTABLISHED BY THE
16 STATE OF COLORADO OR BY A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF COLORADO.

17 (b) A REGULATOR MAY DISMISS A COMPLAINT MADE AGAINST A
18 LICENSEE, CERTIFICANT, OR REGISTRANT IF:

19 (I) THE COMPLAINT IS NOT MADE ANONYMOUSLY; AND

20 (II) THE BASIS FOR THE COMPLAINT ARISES FROM WORDS SAID OR
21 FROM ACTIONS COMMITTED WHILE THE LICENSEE, CERTIFICANT, OR
22 REGISTRANT WAS ENGAGED IN OFFICIAL DUTIES AS:

23 (A) AN ELECTED OFFICIAL OF THE STATE OF COLORADO OR OF A

1 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF COLORADO; OR

2 (B) A MEMBER OF A BOARD OR COMMISSION ESTABLISHED BY THE
3 STATE OF COLORADO OR BY A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF COLORADO.

4 (c) FOR THE REGULATOR TO DISMISS A COMPLAINT IN
5 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION (5), THE LICENSEE, CERTIFICANT, OR
6 REGISTRANT THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF THE COMPLAINT NEED NOT RESPOND
7 TO OR PROVIDE EVIDENCE CONCERNING THE COMPLAINT. THE DISMISSAL
8 IS AUTOMATIC.

9 (d) THIS SUBSECTION (5) DOES NOT APPLY TO WORDS SAID TO OR
10 ACTIONS COMMITTED FOR A SPECIFIC PERSON WHEN THE LICENSEE,
11 CERTIFICANT, OR REGISTRANT IS SPEAKING OR ACTING IN THE LICENSEE'S,
12 CERTIFICANT'S, OR REGISTRANT'S CAPACITY AS A MEMBER OF THE
13 OCCUPATION THE PERSON IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR REGISTERED TO
14 PERFORM.

15 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
16 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
