A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING PEACE OFFICER STATUS FOR CERTAIN DEPARTMENT OF 102 REVENUE EMPLOYEES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill specifies that motor vehicle investigators and criminal tax enforcement special agents are peace officers and must be certified by the peace officers standards and training (P.O.S.T.) board.

Under current law, a group seeking peace officer status for a specific position prepares a proposal for the P.O.S.T. board's review, and, after performing an analysis and hearing, the P.O.S.T. board submits a

HOUSE 2nd Reading Unamended February 14, 2022 report to the group seeking peace officer status and to the judiciary committees of the house of representatives and the senate. The group seeking peace officer status may request legislation during each of the 2 regular legislative sessions that immediately succeed the date of its proposal without having to comply again with certain procedural requirements.

The bill exempts the department of revenue from the requirement to present legislation seeking peace officer status for motor vehicle investigators and criminal tax enforcement special agents within the 2 regular legislative sessions that immediately succeed the date of its proposal without having to comply again with certain procedural requirements.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly finds that:

- (a) On July 1, 2019, pursuant to section 16-2.5-201 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes, the department of revenue submitted a proposal to the P.O.S.T. board seeking peace officer status for the motor vehicle criminal investigator and criminal tax enforcement special agent positions;
- (b) On August 15, 2019, pursuant to section 16-2.5-201 (4), Colorado Revised Statutes, the P.O.S.T. board conducted a hearing with the department of revenue concerning peace officer status for the motor vehicle criminal investigator and criminal tax enforcement special agent positions;
- (c) On October 19, 2019, pursuant to section 16-2.5-201 (5), Colorado Revised Statutes, the P.O.S.T. board submitted a report to the department of revenue and to the judiciary committees of the house of representatives and the senate. The P.O.S.T. board's report recommended peace officer status for the department of revenue's motor vehicle criminal investigator and criminal tax enforcement special agent positions; and

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1	(d) The COVID-19 pandemic frustrated the department of
2	revenue's ability to successfully pursue legislation within the timing
3	required pursuant to section 16-2.5-201 (6), Colorado Revised Statutes;
4	(2) Therefore, the general assembly declares that due to the
5	department of revenue's substantial compliance with statutory obligations,
6	and limitations caused by the circumstances caused by the COVID-19
7	pandemic, it is necessary to exempt the department of revenue from the
8	requirement to present legislation to the general assembly during the two
9	regular legislative sessions that immediately succeed the date of its
10	proposal without having to submit another proposal and have another
11	hearing.
12	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 16-2.5-122.5 and
13	16-2.5-123.5 as follows:
14	16-2.5-122.5. Motor vehicle criminal investigator. A MOTOR
15	VEHICLE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATOR EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
16	REVENUE IS A PEACE OFFICER WHILE ENGAGED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF
17	THE INVESTIGATOR'S DUTIES AND WHOSE PRIMARY AUTHORITY IS AS
18	STATED IN SECTION 42-1-222, AND WHOSE AUTHORITY ALSO INCLUDES
19	THE ENFORCEMENT OF ALL OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO,
20	AND WHO SHALL BE CERTIFIED BY THE P.O.S.T. BOARD.
21	16-2.5-123.5. Criminal tax enforcement special agent. A
22	CRIMINAL TAX ENFORCEMENT SPECIAL AGENT EMPLOYED BY THE
23	DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE IS A PEACE OFFICER WHILE ENGAGED IN THE

2	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 16-2.5-201, add (6.5)
3	as follows:
4	16-2.5-201. General assembly sunrise review of groups seeking
5	statutory peace officer status. (6.5) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (6)
6	OF THIS SECTION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SEEKING PEACE OFFICER STATUS
7	FOR A MOTOR VEHICLE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATOR AND A CRIMINAL TAX
8	ENFORCEMENT SPECIAL AGENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE IS EXEMPT
9	FROM THE REQUIREMENT TO PRESENT APPROPRIATE LEGISLATION TO THE
10	GENERAL ASSEMBLY DURING THE TWO REGULAR LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS
11	THAT IMMEDIATELY SUCCEED THE DATE OF THE PROPOSAL REQUIRED
12	PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION WITHOUT HAVING TO
13	COMPLY AGAIN WITH SUBSECTIONS (2) AND (4) OF THIS SECTION.
14	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-35-119, amend
15	(1)(b) as follows:
16	24-35-119. Law enforcement agencies of department to
17	provide identification cards to retired peace officers upon request -
18	definitions. (1) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise
19	requires:
20	(b) "Peace officer" means a peace officer described in section
21	16-2.5-101, 16-2.5-121, 16-2.5-122, <i>16-2.5-122.5</i> , 16-2.5-123
22	<i>16-2.5-123.5</i> , 16-2.5-124, 16-2.5-124.5, 16-2.5-125, or 16-2.5-126.

24	SECTION 5. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
25	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
26	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
27	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V

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- of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
- 2 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
- 3 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- 4 November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
